In the room, they allege, they found a woman who these officers, Chief Lindsey, Jalier Foster and the jail matrons say is white, but who insists that she is a negro. Jenkins and the woman, who gave her name as Alice Shumaker, were arrested on charges of disorderly conduct.

At the jail the woman was slated as white, but beside her name was written, "claims she is colored." The woman is 30 years old and good looking. She said she had been married and lived in Shippingport, but was separated from her husband. A blood test will be made at the jail to determine whether or not she is a negro.

A short time after this arrest the same officers, accompanied by Lieut. Schupp, arrested George Eaton, a 16-year-old negro boy, on a charge of grand larceny, and in his inside coat pocket were found the photographs of three pretty white girls, none of whom is older than 18 years. Eaton refused to tell whose pictures they were, but said that the girls had given them to him. The police took the pictures, and Corp. Sullivan is making a round of photograph galleries to learn the identity of the girls. Eaton was arrested in a bicycle store on Preston street while trying to collect money for a bicycle which he sold there yesterday. The wheel was stolen from William Wells, a messenger boy for the Western Union Telegraph Company, who lives at 321 Hancock street, according to the police.
